Claims are listed according to the Occupational Injury and Illness Classification System (OIICS) and the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Standard Occupational Coding (SOC), 2000 edition. Counts are based on the date the Department of Consumer and Business Services received notification that the claim was accepted, which may be different than the date of injury or illness.

Other = Other OIICS categories not listed.
