Accepted disabling claims are claims, accepted by insurers, arising from occupational injuries or diseases that entitle workers to compensation for disability or death.

Claims are listed according to the North American Industrial Classification System, 2002 edition (NAICS) and the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Standard Occupational Coding, 2000 edition (SOC).
