Compensable fatalities are claims, accepted by insurers, arising from a fatal occupational injury or disease that entitles workers and/or their survivors to compensation. Data exclude deaths of workers not subject to Oregon workers' compensation coverage, such as workers who were self-employed, worked in Oregon for out-of-state employers, city of Portland police and fire employees, or federal employees. Data are based on the date the Department of Consumer and Business Services received notification that the fatality claim was accepted, which may be different than the date of injury or the date of death.

Events are classified according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics Occupational Injury and Illness Classification System (OIICS). Industries are classified according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), 2002 edition. Employees of client leasing firms are reported by the industry in which they were working when injured.

Dashes indicate no claims were received.
0.0 percent indicates that the percentage of claims is less than 0.05.

Source data are continually updated to be as accurate as possible, so report results may vary over time.
