Compensable fatalities are claims accepted by insurers arising from a fatal occupational injury or disease that entitle workers or their survivors to compensation.

Data exclude deaths of exempt workers, such as workers who were self-employed, worked in Oregon for out-of-state employers, city of Portland police and fire employees, or federal employees. Data are based on the date the Department of Consumer and Business Services received notification that the fatal claim was accepted, which may be different than the date of injury or illness or the date of death. Dashes indicate no claims were received.

Industries are classified according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), 2007 edition. Employees of client leasing firms are reported by the industry in which they were working at the time of injury.

Source data are continually updated to be as accurate as possible, so report results may vary over time.
