Accepted disabling claims are claims, accepted by insurers, arising from occupational injuries or diseases that entitle workers to compensation for disability or death.

The current table includes accepted disabling claims in which either the primary or secondary source of the injury was either a forklift (source codes 8510-8519) or another powered industrial carrier (source codes 8520-8529).

Source of injury is classified according to the Occupational Injury and Illness Classification System (OIICS).

If two industrial vehicles were involved in the incident (e.g., a collision between two forklifts), the incident was classified according to primary source.

- Dashes indicate no claims were received.

0.0 percent indicates the percentage of claims calculates to less than 0.5 percent.
