Compensable fatalities are claims, accepted by insurers, arising from a fatal occupational injury or disease that entitles workers and/or their survivors to compensation. Data exclude deaths of workers not subject to Oregon Workers' Compensation coverage, such as workers who were self-employed, worked in Oregon for out-of-state employers, city of Portland police and fire employees, or federal employees. Occupation is classified according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics' [Standard Occupational Coding Manual](#) (SOC), May 2000 edition.

During 2004, the Oregon Workers' Compensation Division began converting claims data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics Occupational Coding (OCC) system to the new Bureau of Labor Statistics Standard Occupational Coding (SOC). Tables for 2004, 2005, and 2006 are available for fatalities by OCC and SOC codes. Previous years' tables were presented using OCC codes only.
