Compensable fatalities are claims accepted by insurers arising from a fatal occupational injury or disease that entitle workers and/or their survivors to compensation. Data exclude deaths of noncovered workers such as workers who were self-employed, worked in Oregon for out-of-state employers, city of Portland police and fire employees, or federal employees. Tenure is the length of time the employee had been working for the employer at time of injury or exposure. Claims are listed according to the Occupational Injury and Illness Classification System (OIICS) and are based on the date the Department of Consumer and Business Services received notification that the fatal claim was accepted, which may be different than the date of injury or illness.
