Compensable fatalities are claims accepted by insurers arising from a fatal occupational injury or disease that entitle workers or their survivors to compensation.

Data exclude deaths of exempt workers, such as workers who were self-employed, worked in Oregon for out-of-state employers, City of Portland police and fire employees, or federal employees. Yearly fatality counts are based upon the date the Department of Consumer and Business Services received notification the fatal claim was accepted. The claim acceptance date may be different than the date of injury or illness or the date of death. Dashes indicate no claims were received.

Injury age is the age of the employee at the time of the fatal injury or the diagnosis of the fatal illness. It may be different than the age at death.

Tenure is the length of time an employee had been working for the employer at the time of the injury or illness and may not represent the overall experience of the worker.

Source data are continually updated to be as accurate as possible. Report results may vary over time.
